PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I'm sure I'm not the only one asking "will this winter ever end?" In any case it's been busy to say the least. By the time this newsletter comes out you will no doubt realize that we have changed the refuse company to Youngblood and as a reminder **refuse collection will now be on TUESDAY's beginning March 5th. The new company is Youngblood/Casella.** We have entered into a one-year contract with them and will review that at the appropriate time for renewal if we are satisfied. Three bids were obtained for the purpose of getting the best price.

We also entered into a new one-year contract with Broccolo Tree and Landscape for lawn fertilizing. And as with the refuse we obtained three bids for those services as well with the board deciding on Broccolo with an option for two, additional one-year contracts, with increases of no more than 2% per year (suggested by Bob Gerace).

The Roofing Committee has been busy with several roofing companies and had Upstate Roofing examine several roofs both on the exterior and interior. The committee and several board members will meet with Upstate in March to discuss their findings. Once we have information as to the extent of suggested roof repairs, the Treasurer and co treasurer can begin to review possible assessments intended for the roof project. The board is now considering dates for a "listening session" with this information to be shared. More still must be done in this regard.

The general insurance policy for the entire community which covers the structure and common property for liability is up for renewal in March and is being reviewed as we speak.

As you can plainly see it's been busy despite the cold and snow.

I personally want to take this time to thank the board members for their time and talents as it couldn't be done without them. We as a community should be proud of the board members that choose to take the time to share their talents. We are blessed to have so many who step up to the plate each and every day to make it a better place to live. If you have an interest in a position on the board please see Mary Ann Keegan, Debbie Bellisario or Bob Gerace as they are all on the nominating committee.
